Organ Maintenance: From 6 January – 21 February essential maintenance work will be taking place on Exeter Cathedral's Grand Organ. The work will involve a complete renewal of the organ's reservoirs and trunking which provide wind to the instrument. Our service schedule will continue as normal and will be accompanied by piano and chamber organ.

Access to the Quire: will be limited for much of January due to the construction of scaffolding in preparation for the renewal of the sound and lighting systems in that area. Worship will continue as scheduled in the Nave.

Well-Tempered Clavier for Cathedral Choir Tour

While the main organ is out of action for two months at the beginning of this year, our Organ Scholar, Adam Field, will be playing the complete Well-Tempered Clavier by J. S. Bach as voluntaries before and after choral services. This will be in aid of the Cathedral Choir tour to Normandy and Paris in July this year.
